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# *Minimum Standards for JIC Implementation*



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# *Standards for selection of JIC facilitators*

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- *The facilitators should come from the target group aged 15-24 years*
- *Minimum of two O level subjects including English Language for community facilitators*
- *Oral interview and passing of JIC competence test*
- *Undergo intensive (5 days) standardized training organised by FACT and conducted by trained trainer of trainers.*
  - *Develop full understanding of HIV\SRH–related topics in the context of the local sociocultural context*
  - *Have comprehensive knowledge of the roles and functions of JIC facilitators.*
- *Gender balance*



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# *General standards for JIC runs*

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- *Target group age 15 – 24 years*
- *At least six stations should be conducted*
- *All stations to be conducted simultaneously*
- *JIC run activities to be conducted in 15 minutes per station.*
- *HTC should be available after JIC runs*
- *Facilitators should know about next referral hospitals*
- *Referral slips should be issued to all participants.*
- *All participants to complete pre and post test.*
- *1 supervisor/time keeper should be present at each JIC run*
- *Leaflets, brochures or hand outs on specific topics available*



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# *Specification for Out-of-school JIC runs*

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- *A minimum of 20 participants*
- *JIC team should have at least 4 facilitators*
- *3 stations can be conducted simultaneously (depends on number of youths)*
- *All participants to be issued with referral slip and pre and post test*
- *HTC services should be available after the JIC run.*
- *For mobilisation involve*
  - *local leadership at all levels*
  - *the nurses at nearby clinics for referral*



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# *Specification for In-School JIC Runs*

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- *Only secondary school participants age >15*
- *A maximum of 12 participants should be assigned to each station ( 84 participants total)*
- *JIC team should have 7-14 facilitators, 1 or 2 per station*
- *Mobilisation done by JIC coordinator through school administration*
- *Involve the nurses at nearby clinics for referral*
- *All participants to be issued with referral slip*
- *20% of female and 20% of male participants to complete pre and post test*
- *HTC services should be available after the JIC run.*



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# *Specification for tertiary level JIC run*

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- *Select JIC facilitators within the target group especially first year students*
- *A maximum of 12 participants should be assigned to each station ( 84 participants total)*
- *JIC team should have 7-14 facilitators, 1 or 2 per station*
- *Same standards as for in school applies.*
- *For mobilisation involve*
  - *Dean of Students*
  - *Students Representative Committee,*
  - *Life Skills Coordinator*
  - *Peer Educators*
  - *Nurses from on site clinic*



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# *Specification for JIC advocacy*

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- *> 84 participants*
- *Larger venues such as sports gala, agricultural shows, markets etc.*
- *Not to be reported as a JIC run*
- *Should be reported under other youth groups reached and commented*
- *If HTC services provided then reported separately*
- *Referrals to YFC and health institutions should be reported separately*
